WIZARD WISDOM – We suggest that you share the story of Helen Keller, a famous American who became blind and deaf at age two. A number of children’s books have been written about Helen. In her story, Helen’s private teacher, Annie Sullivan, tirelessly taught Helen braille and sign language, enabling her to communicate. Suggest to kids that they use the braille and sign language alphabets above to spell their names. Further discussion along with this exercise may help kids become more compassionate toward the handicapped.
